No apparent gap in W.m. - no S.m. at all.

Yet - seems to be roadway going due South to us.

- very nice & straight - sort of cambered effect

- S. from coming.

Just west of mc. - S.m. appears as gentle slope - cut across by cultivation ridges.

Come to an apparent gap - looks modern.

Then V. lovely - very large, fat continuous W.m.

- military way on it?

N.b. delightfully broad & flattish.

- ditch now is shallow little r/r.

S.b. very good & broad.

S.m. distinct but not particularly good.

Slope from N. to S. No m.m.

2 gaps in S.m - long distance /. them - with corresponding d.f.'s. - 2nd filling stretches for 30 ft. or so - S. gap is large one too.

At 2nd one - gap thro' W.m. - modern?

(There is one further East almost where another crossing ought to have been.)

Last c. - gap in S.m. - no apparent d.f.

N.m. continuous.

Mounds tampered with - is break in W.m. just by fence.

Cheat pasture - W.m. beautifully preserved - flat & broad.

N.b. good. S.m. just visible. S.b. not good.

Ditch is narrow sandy silt.

1st.c. - followed by modern cast-hack wh. cuts
thru' W.m.

- d.f. good - slight gap in S.m.

Ind. gap in N.m. - slight d.f. opposite - very close to
1st.c. - no gap in S.

3rd. d.f. - short distance - only 20 yds. or so.

3rd. gap in N.m. - another d.f. - good - covered in

Ditch good - but at a much higher level than before causeways.

Stones show tho' mounds.

Wonderful views all round. Craters all over the place.

S.m. seems beautifully swetted.

Not much left of either beam.

When in ditch - mounds tower up on either side.

Here the Vallum leaves road & goes northwards with the
wall which begins to ascend the hills & creeps.
With a small plantation to our left we proceed up
sheet pasture.

Here the Vallum is the picturesque course of the Coesike.
Boulders & rocks dot its course - on either side it
slopes steeply upwards - there is no N.B. but
the N.m. is high.

S.b. runs along a good course - the wall of the
plantation is one S.m.

1st.c. - slight gap in both mounds
to boulders in middle of S.b.

2nd.c. - depression in N.m. & S.m.

3rd.c. - both mounds - & traces of d.f.
- beams slightly depressed.

N. b. now is much better.

4th.c. - 2 good gaps - wall of plantation has fallen
down there. Vall. is now gently curving

(?) 8th.c. Excellent gap in N.m.

S. beam is good roadside (rest here for road!)

9th.c. - N.beam gap.

low ditch not so deep - a bit wider.

S.b. rather stoney but N.b. much more so.

h.m. very stoney too! Revetment?

11thc. - both gaps good - ditch on level with bottom of gap
— shallow for a little way

12thc. - N. gap good - S. gap barely visible

Both mounds in good preservation here.

13thc. jolly good crossing - both gaps excellent
- definite d.f. — lots of rock around
— masking roadway?

Beams depressed - like m.c. causeway.

m.c. 34? - just S.E. of small clump of trees with wall

Sewingshields: 14thc. - 2 gaps good - no filling

NB no h.m. here at all.

15thc. - not easily distinguishable

16thc. - very slight depressions in both mounds - more
of a notch.

Next — slight gaps.

I don't think there is any h.m. after all.

S. beam excellent.

flat road paving stone — just on line with S tip

One or two more in line - edging stones?
6 altogether.

17thc. - nice gap in N.m - shallow tho'
- & slight one in S.m. too.

Chest - slight gap in N.

- seems to be very slight h.m. here.

Chest - N.m. gap only.

- ditch nice up to next wall from here
S.b. good - h.m? or not.

Chest c - dep. in S. - not in north.

slope from N. to S. here.

Chest C. - in chest field. ie. to South of Sewingshield

Crossing good - nice d.f. too.

In this field - Vall. is excellently preserved.

N. & S. mounds very fine - S.b. particularly good
- N.b. more on slope.

h.m. reappears - reasonable size -

still not far from wall, but we are in bottom of
